The event opened with a fun and relaxing session where volunteers from the Singapore Women Association led the audience — including Mr Seow Choke Meng, Ren Ci Chairman; Mr Lim Chai Boon, Vice-Chair; and Mr Wong Hsien Xiong, Board Director — in a "Laughter Yoga" session. The event saw us honoring many of our volunteers who from across our three sites: a total of 120 long-serving volunteers, 6 of them having served with us for 25 years, and 26 corporate and community partners.

# Project Silvercare

Ren Ci Active Aging Centre (transition) Friends @ Ren Ci collaborated with St Luke's Hospital (SLH) to bring Project Silvercare to our community seniors. This is a community health screening project jointly organized with students from National University of Singapore's faculties of Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy.

Project Silvercare is an extension of the Western Silvercare programme, where seniors in the community come down to the Community Health Post set up at Ren Ci @ Bukit Batok St. 52 and are assessed by SLH's nurses. The Project Silvercare outreach programme gets seniors to undergo Medical, Nutritional, Physical and Cognitive assessments, followed by a doctors' review.

As a member organisation of the Singapore Hospice Council (SHC), Ren Ci Hospital was honoured to be invited to participate in the inaugural Live Well. Leave Well. Festival 2023, held from 13 to 22 October at the National Library Building, The Plaza.

Ren Ci Hospital set up a booth to showcase our palliative care services, as well as artworks done during Art Therapy sessions by Mr Ong Chwee Aik, a former palliative care patient. Ms Poh Shu Ning, Senior Art Therapist; Ms Jolene Yee, Music Therapist; and Ms Nadirah Chee, Senior Medical Social Worker also conducted a workshop titled Enduring Connections in Grief & Loss - "Precious Gems, Precious Virtues" during the festival. The event was a success, reaching over 5000 footfall and registered participants for the events. The 28 talks, webinars and workshops had more than 700 attendees! When a patient steps into a hospital, their journey to heal begins. For healthcare workers, this is an everyday occurrence but to the patients, it is a momentous and significant event that greatly impacts their body, mind, soul and psyche. My artworks have likened the journey to a ships' voyage (thus the many ships amongst my paintings), often impacted by storms and threatening waves.

Most patients recover, but unfortunately some do not. Our hope remains that as we journey alongside them and their families, they can traverse troubled waters with serenity and confidence; and eventually reach safe harbour, wherever that may be.

## 2023年慈善透明奖


