## Leadership Transition at Ren Ci Board

Dr Chua Thian Poh has retired from the Board of Ren Ci Hospital after 21 years of service at one of Singapore's largest non-profit healthcare institution. Ren Ci Hospital was established in 1994 to provide care for needy beneficiaries with chronic care needs and it has since expanded its services steadily over the last 27 years. Dr Chua was also the Chairman in the last 14 years.

Mr Seow Choke Meng, a veteran with Singapore Press Holdings and former Board member on National Healthcare Group and National Council of Social Services, has taken over the role as Chairman. The leadership transition coincides with the new two-year term for the Ren Ci Board which takes effect from 1 July 2021. Besides Dr Chua, the Board also saw another five retiring Board members with two new incoming members.

Dr Chua will be greatly missed by all in the Ren Ci family."

# Taking on New Roles amid COVID

For Nazirah and Ilylia, the COVID-19 pandemic gave them the time to think, reflect and also to plunge head-on into job roles within the community care sector. Hear from them how they ended up in Ren Ci as Resident Care Associates (RCA).

## HOW HAVE YOU BEEN AFFECTED BY COVID-19?

**N:** Since the start of the pandemic, I was without a full-time job and only managed to become a safe distancing ambassador as an interim measure. It was really a big challenge for me to get a permanent job.

**I:** I was a Food Panda delivery rider and freelance designer prior to lockdown. I was doing relatively well until the pandemic forced many others to join the food delivery sector and I wasn't able to earn as much.

## WHAT MADE YOU THINK ABOUT JOINING THE COMMUNITY CARE SECTOR THEN?

**Both** (*laughing*): *Well, this sector was actively hiring!*

**N:** At the same time, I had enjoyed a close relationship with my late grandmother. As such, I am confident that I would be able to interact well with elderly nursing home residents.

**I:** As for me, I've been brought up by a single mother and I do wonder about how I'm going to care for her in the future. I think joining the community care sector will enable me to learn necessary care skills which would be useful in the future.

## WHAT WERE SOME OF THE CHALLENGES YOU FACED IN THE NEW ROLE?

**N:** It was challenging to get to know the residents well in a short time. Each resident has different conditions such as dementia and different likes and dislikes. It took me some time to understand their behaviours.


**I:** Coming from a different industry, I had very little knowledge about how to care for the seniors. Learning the healthcare terms and jargons and remembering the different protocols were some challenges which I had to overcome.

## TAKING ON A NEW ROLE CAN BE QUITE DAUNTING! WHAT KEEPS YOU GOING?

**N:** The encouragement and support from my family and fellow colleagues have been the energy source that kept me going. I told myself that engaging in community care will have a lasting, positive impact to the seniors we serve. The trainings have also given me the confidence to carry out my tasks well.

**I:** The nursing home residents have accepted my care and are drawn to me whenever I'm on shift. I have this sense of duty to help them achieve better quality of life in the home.

# Art Therapy @ Ren Ci

Art Therapy is a form of psychotherapy that uses visual arts to support patients to improve their psychosocial and socio-emotional well-being. Art Therapy is facilitated by Art Therapists who have undergone post-graduate training in the field. This therapeutic modality was formally introduced in Ren Ci in 2017. Here, Ms Poh Shu Ning (MA AThR), Art Therapist based in Ren Ci Community Hospital, shares her journey with one of our patients.

“ I've had the privilege of engaging Mr Ong Chwee Aik in Art Therapy since March this year. Mr Ong has Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) which causes him to cough and suffer from progressive breathlessness. He is being cared for as a patient from the ICARE (or Integrated Care for Advanced Respiratory Disorders) programme at Ren Ci Hospital and Art Therapy was offered to help support his emotional well-being. As his Art Therapist, my goal would be to facilitate the process of self-understanding and self-expression for Mr Ong via art, with the aim of enhancing his overall care and clinical outcomes.

The sessions always begin with shared conversations about art. Mr Ong said he likes viewing and admiring the works of famous artists although he had never formally made art. While receiving rehabilitation care at Ren Ci Hospital, we found ways of appreciating art together, either virtually or through physical art catalogues of various artists working with various mediums. The viewing of these artworks encouraged Mr Ong to share personal connections, associations and insights. Some images also had the effect of improving his mood by helping him to relax.



During weekly Art Therapy sessions, Mr Ong started to embrace the instinctual flow of creativity that was within him and expressed them through his drawings. He was initially critical and self-conscious of his efforts, but with encouragement, he was emboldened to trust his own creative process. When a box of charcoal sticks was presented to him, Mr Ong was overjoyed and expressed how he could now draw anywhere he wanted! He was motivated to capture the fleeting moments in the ward, and started connecting with his hospital environment. Mr Ong made numerous sketches of ward staff, patients, the electronic ornamental bird gifted to him by his granddaughter and even food that was on his bedside table.

Through his art, he identified what was important to him and contemplated ways of being in the here and now as well as in the future to support his personhood. He explored feelings of loneliness and frustration from his recurrent hospitalisations, the impacts of COPD, hopes, unfulfilled wishes and his mortality.

With his new found confidence and identity as an artist, Mr Ong would often invite me to show his sketches to other colleagues. I then asked if Mr Ong would like to formally share his artworks with others through his first solo art show. Mr Ong agreed immediately and decided to title his art show “随心所欲的画” (Creating to My Heart's Content). An online art show was also curated to allow Mr Ong to continue to maintain social connection with his long-time friends of more than 60 years. They met as students at Dunman High School, and he used to meet with them regularly. The online show also allowed Mr Ong to share his creative legacy with his extended family members who could not view the physical art show due to restrictions in visitation at the hospital.

The art show at the ward was well received by Mr Ong's family, staff and patients alike. Mr Ong received praises from his daughters who commented, “家里出了个画家” (“There's now an artist in our family!”). Mr Ong gave many thumbs up and beamed with pride. Meeting the universal yearnings to be seen, to feel valued, loved and accomplished, was at the core of psychosocial care for Mr Ong, which perhaps motivated Mr Ong to continue to create.

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Mr Ong's indomitable and renewed spirit, openness and courage to step into his own art process, offers a glimpse of how creativity can be a vital healing force in face of multiple losses. 

# “随心所欲的画”私人画展


艺术治疗是一种心理治疗，以艺术媒体作为主要的表达和沟通方式。通过创造过程，与艺术治疗师的扶持，强化参与者的心緒素质。在这一期的《超越无限》，我们邀请在仁慈医院担任艺术治疗师的傅淑宁与大家分享她艺术治疗的这一段旅程。

“让我留下最深刻的印象的是来自仁慈社区医院的病患王水益先生。我从3月开始与王先生进行艺术治疗。王先生患有慢性阻塞性肺病，呼吸困难和咳嗽，他也是仁慈医院重度气喘综合疗护计划（I-CARE）的病患。作为他的艺术治疗师，我的目标是通过艺术来促进王先生的自我理解和自我表达的过程从而提高他的整体护理和临床结果。”

我们的艺术治疗都会以关于艺术的共享对话开始。王先生表示，虽然他从未正式接触过艺术，但他喜欢观赏和欣赏著名艺术家的作品。在仁慈医院接受治疗的这段期间，我们为王先生设计一些欣赏艺术的方案，无论是虚拟的观赏艺术作品，还是通过各种媒介工作的实体艺术目录。观看这些艺术品间接鼓励王先生与我分享他个人的点点滴滴。一些艺术品还可以帮助他放松和改善他的情绪。

王先生在接受艺术治疗时，慢慢扮演起艺术家的角色，他经常会与其他的病友和医护人员分享他的作品。他喜欢使用炭笔作画，以他的视角来画出他在医院里观看到的任何事和物，例如医护人员和病友的素描。有一段时间，王先生的画中频频出现一只鹦鹉。当我询问他为什么在他的画里经常出现一只鹦鹉时，他告诉我那是一只声控鹦鹉玩具，是他的九岁孙女送给他的生日礼物。王先生通过他的作品来表达他的想法，他的孤独感和沮丧感、慢性阻塞性肺病对他的影响、他的希望、他未实现的愿望和他对死亡的看法。




